



























Geometry of The Buildings

The general concept for individual buildings and them structure is based on the geometry of the tree. From the base, the building begins to grow / expand like the core of a tree, when reaching a certain point they merge into one large crown of a tree. The geometry passes from a very rectangular from the main facade at Charing Cross Road, slowly going into a more organic form and disconnects into smaller "trees" in response to the geometry of the adjacent chapel at Manette Street. In addition, the area is lowered by 2 meters in relation to the road to obtain a relatively quiet and peaceful public space creating a sound barrier.
