Ammodo Architecture Celebrates 26 Awardees for Socially and Ecologically Responsible Architecture Worldwide

Amsterdam, 13 November 2025

The second edition of the Ammodo Architecture Award recognises 26 recipients for their exemplary contributions to socially and ecologically responsible architecture. Selected from 168 entries submitted from over 60 countries, the awardees represent a wide range of practices — from established studios to community-led initiatives and collectives. Together, they showcase the rich diversity of global architectural practice and set new standards for social engagement and ecological responsiveness.

Each awardee receives a grant ranging from €10,000 to €150,000 to support the further development of their projects. Beyond providing recognition and financial support, Ammodo Architecture functions as a knowledge platform that connects awardees across regions, facilitates the sharing of insights with a wider public, and highlights key themes and directions emerging from the advisory committee's selection.

Global Award: Common Threads

This year's nominations span six regions — Africa, Asia, Europe, North & Central America, South America, and Southeast Asia & Oceania — reflecting the global reach and diversity of contemporary architectural practice. From Mexico and Austria to Ghana, Bangladesh and China, the selected projects engage both urban and rural contexts, addressing urgent issues such as housing, education, ecological restoration, and collective living.

The awarded projects reveal shared concerns including adaptive reuse, urban rehabilitation, the transmission of traditional crafts and knowledge, and the restoration of ecological systems. Each project not only responds to the specific challenges of its context but also imagines new possibilities for how architecture can connect communities, nurture environments, and enrich lives.

A Multidisciplinary Advisory Committee

Awardees were chosen by a global advisory committee chaired by **Joumana El Zein Khoury**, Executive Director of the World Press Photo Foundation, Amsterdam, and including: **Andrés Jaque**, Architect, Dean and Professor, Columbia University GSAPP, New York; **Anupama Kundoo**, Architect and Professor, TU Berlin; **Floris Alkemade**, Architect and former Chief Government Architect of the Netherlands; **Mariam Issoufou**, Architect and Professor, ETH Zurich; and **Loreta Castro Reguera**, Architect and Professor, UNAM Mexico City. Projects were sourced through an invitation system organized by regional ambassadors, ensuring global representation and diversity.

Award Categories and Selected Projects

Social Architecture – €150,000

The Social Architecture category honours two outstanding architects and design teams who present an oeuvre with a strong dedication and involvement in the field of socially and ecologically responsible architecture. This year's recipients are SHAU (Indonesia) for **Kampung Mrican Phase 1**, and *gaupenraub+/-* (Austria) for **VinziRast am Land**. Both projects show how reuse, participation and care can address climate and social challenges through resource-conscious design. SHAU will use the award to build a new microlibrary in Indonesia. *gaupenraub+/-* will use the prize money to support the design of an inclusive hotel and a new housing project for formerly homeless residents, as well as to develop a digital toolkit for sharing knowledge within the professional and academic fields.

Social Engagement – €50,000

This category recognizes twelve projects that show how architects and design teams use design skills as the primary tool to support social and ecological responsibility. Examples include: the **Zheshui Natural Library** by LUO Studio (China), built collaboratively with villagers in Shanxi's Taihang Mountains, and the **Machan_Korail Community Platform** by Paraa and local residents (Bangladesh), which transforms a former dumping ground in Dhaka into a flexible public space for art, learning and dialogue. LUO Studio will use the grant to establish a sustainable co-creation studio for rural ecological development in Shangling Village, while Paraa will fund a co-designed, community-built intervention through participatory workshops, training and local events in Dhaka.

Local Scale - €10,000

The Local Scale category celebrates twelve self-initiated socially and ecologically oriented spatial projects that have a local impact. Examples include: the **Main Stage of MuyunaFest** by Espacio Común (Peru), a floating cultural hub built with local materials and knowledge in the amphibious jungle neighborhood of Belén, Iquitos; and the **Magdy El Khouly Street Renovation** by Ahmed Hossam Saafan (AHS CxA) (Egypt), a pilot project revitalizing public life in Ezbet

Khairallah, Cairo, which reclaims urban space for women and children through small-scale, inclusive interventions. Espacio Común will use the award to build a new stage for the 2026 edition of Muyuna Fest, which will later be adapted into a permanent public space, while AHS CxA will fund a participatory, ecoconscious temporary public space intervention in Ezbet Khairallah.
