01 About Riyadh Art




Riyadh Art is one of Riyadh's four original mega projects under Vision 2030 and is led by the Royal Commission for Riyadh City. Launched in 2019, it was developed to catalyze the capital's transformation, enrich lives, and encourage creative expression and cross-cultural dialogue through art.

Art and culture are essential to the identity of a city, and the Riyadh Art initiative was established to reflect the openness and accessibility of the capital's growing creative landscape; where the exchange of ideas through artistic practice contributes to a deeper and more inclusive cultural identity.

Riyadh Art aims to have a positive impact on people, bringing everyday moments of joy to residents and visitors alike, while instilling a greater sense of civic pride and creating a more beautiful city for everyone to enjoy. It also supports the growth of the creative economy and contributes to attracting investment and talent to Riyadh.

Noor Riyadh, launched in March 2021, is a citywide annual festival of light and art. It is the largest light art festival in the world. Noor Riyadh is a 17-day festival that includes a public program of community activities featuring educational workshops, talks, and performances.

Noor Riyadh bring together high-quality light artworks from leading international and Saudi artists across the city's widest footprint of any light art festival worldwide. Staged under Riyadh Art, the festival aims to nurture local talent and inspire youth to drive Saudi Arabia's creative economy.

05 Curatorial Theme



In the Blink of an Eye

The theme illuminates Noor Riyadh 2025, casting a vibrant constellation of light art across the city's heart and along the sleek, modern lines of its new metro system.

This edition of the festival celebrates Riyadh's rapid transformation. Its embrace of science, technology, and innovation. The narrative unfolds in two interwoven paths: in the historic center, light-based artworks converse with ancient architecture, bridging the city's rich cultural heritage with its energetic present. In contrast, the metro stations radiate a pulse of modernity, animated by installations that reflect the pace and rhythm of urban life.

Light, evocative of movement and speed, serves as both medium and message in this year's edition of Noor Riyadh. Kinetic sculptures and responsive installations trace the flow of people, visualizing connectivity and interaction. This year's bold works capture Riyadh's spirit of continuous transformation, embodying a city that is constantly in motion.

The festival invites visitors on a journey between eras, a place where tradition meets transformation. It is a metaphor for Riyadh's broader trajectory: honoring the past while fearlessly looking ahead. Artists from around the world push the boundaries of light, using cutting-edge technology to spark reflection on the relationship between humanity, innovation, and urban change.

In the Blink of an Eye celebrates Riyadh as a city on the move, where heritage and progress converge in a luminous expression of possibility.



Addie Wagenknecht (b. 1981) is a conceptual American artist whose practice critically explores the intersection of technology, abstraction, and social isolation. A pioneer in the use of drones and automation for painting, Wagenknecht has exhibited at MuseumsQuartier Wien, Istanbul Modern, the Whitney Museum of American Art in New York, the Centre Pompidou and La Gaîté Lyrique in Paris, the New Museum in New York, and Whitechapel Gallery in London. She has collaborated with Chanel and Google's AI group, received an honorary mention for the Collide Award, and held fellowships at the Frank-Ratchye Studio at Carnegie Mellon and Culture Lab UK.

Abdulrahman AlSoliman (b. 1954) is a pioneering figure in Saudi contemporary art and the first President of the Saudi Society of Fine Arts. His artworks, deeply informed by local tradition, combine geometric precision with lyrical expression. His work has been showcased from Jeddah and Tangier to Vienna and Sotheby's London. AlSoliman has received local and international awards, including third prize at the Sharjah International Biennial in 1997. He is also an eminent art historian and author of The Journey of the Saudi Fine Arts Movement (2000). AlSoliman's abstract practice constructs a distinct visual language exploring memory, heritage, and homeland.

Abdelrahman Elshahed (b. 1993) is an esteemed Saudi calligrapher, architect, and founder of Makhtut Studio, which integrates design with artistic experimentation. Elshahed received formal training in Arabic calligraphy at the Grand Mosque in Makkah. His works, infused with spiritual geometry, are held at UNESCO Paris, the Prince Mohammed bin Salman Global Center for Arabic Calligraphy, and the Canadian Museum of Nature. Elshahed won the Okaz International Prize for Arabic Calligraphy in 2011 and designed one of the world's largest calligraphy gates for the Jeddah International Book Fair in 2016.

Ahmad Angawi (b. 1981) is a Jeddah-based Saudi artist, designer, and educator whose interdisciplinary practice bridges art, design, and craft. Known for reviving *Mangour*, a traditional Hijazi woodwork technique, he reinterprets heritage within a contemporary context. Guided by the philosophy of *Al Mizan* (balance), he merges Islamic craft legacies with contemporary approaches. Angawi founded Angawi Studio and Zawiya 97, and played a key role in establishing the House of Traditional Arts in Jeddah. His work has been exhibited internationally, including a permanent Mangour installation at the British Museum.

Alex Schweder (b. 1970) is an influential American artist who coined the term "Performance Architecture," which explores how built environments cue human behavior while acting as props that shape identity. His acclaimed work has been exhibited at the Museum of Modern Art, Tate Britain, the Venice Architecture Biennale, and Performa. Schweder's practice has been recognized through residencies at Civitella Ranieri, the Kohler Arts Center, and the Chinati Foundation, as well as the prestigious Rome Prize Fellowships awarded by Civitella Ranieri and the Graham Foundation.

Alexandra Gelis (b. 1975) is a Colombian-Venezuelan-Canadian media artist and researcher who explores the relationships between plants and humans, as well as socio-political ecologies. A recipient of the Paavo and Aino Lukkari Award, the Grace and David Taylor Graduate Scholarship, and fellowships from the Canada Council for the Arts and Colciencias, Gelis holds a PhD in Environmental Studies from York University and authored the monograph *Alexandra Gelis: Seed.* Her pioneering media works and experimental projects have been presented at the Walker Art Center, the Oberhausen Short Film Festival, and the Bienal del Sur.

Ayoung Kim (b. 1979) is a Korean artist whose practice spans video, game simulation, performance, and sonic fiction. Her hybrid narratives reimagine reality by integrating geopolitics, mythology, technology, and futuristic iconography. Kim's work has been presented at MoMA PS1 (2025), Tate Modern (2025), M+ in Hong Kong (2025), MoMA in New York (2024), Sharjah Biennial 15 (2023), and the 56th Venice Biennale (2015). She has received the LG Guggenheim Award from the Solomon R. Guggenheim Foundation (2025), the ACC Future Prize in South Korea (2024), and the Golden Nica from Prix Ars Electronica in Austria (2023).

atelier oï was founded in 1991 by the Swiss design trio Aurel Aebi (b. 1966), Armand Louis (b. 1966), and Patrick Reymond (b. 1962), with a practice that dissolves boundaries between architecture, design, scenography, and naval construction. Their accolades include the Prix Européen du Musée du Conseil de l'Europe — European Museum of the Year Award for Museum Laténium, and the Premio dei Premi per l'Innovazione (2020) from the Italian Presidency.

WonderGlass, founded in 2013 by the father-and-son duo Maurizio and Christian Mussati, brings Venetian glassmaking traditions into contemporary art, merging craftsmanship with innovation.

Christian Partos (b. 1958) is an innovative Swedish artist renowned for kinetic sculptures and immersive light installations that fuse art, science, and technology, merging the grand theatrical with the subdued poetic. A graduate of Konstfack in Stockholm, his career is marked by significant public commissions across Europe, including *Spårsken* at Malmö's Triangeln Station and *Modern Maskaron* at Stockholm's Kulturhuset. His works explore perception and the unseen, addressing connections between technology and organisms through antiquarian books and computerized LED systems.

Christophe Berthonneau (b. 1963) has created multidisciplinary works centered on light for forty years, blending technologies from ancient techniques to cutting-edge experiments. His large-scale projects fuse land art with popular events, creating immersive experiences where light is both language and material. Guided by a poetic approach, he explores light's interaction with the environment. A French innovator, Berthonneau has developed tools in scenography, pyrotechnics, lighting, and drone technology, designing unique and impactful events. He received Thea Awards for Best Live Show in 2000 and 2023.

Fabio Volpi (b. 1971), operating as dies_, is an Italian multimedia artist who explores the intersection of sound, light, and spatial design. A former member of the Otolab collective, his immersive projection mappings and audiovisual performances earned him the Celeste Prize in Berlin and first prize at Kyiv's Light Festival. His innovative work has been presented at prestigious platforms, including Lille, Basel, and Shenzhen. A trained architect, dies_ also teaches multimedia arts at NABA Academy and the Milan Conservatory.

Dr. Saad Al Howede (b. 1975) is a pivotal Saudi multidisciplinary artist who critically interrogates memory, heritage, and historical archives. With a PhD in Art Philosophy, he conceptually incorporates academic research into immersive installations that examine revisionist, post-memory, and collective oblivion, inviting reflection. A former caricaturist and journalist, Al Howede is a laureate of the Alma Mater residency in France. He has exhibited at prestigious institutions such as El Museo Nacional de Arte Decorativo in Buenos Aires and SAMoCa Riyadh.

Edwin van der Heide (b. 1970) is a prominent Dutch artist and researcher whose work advances the concepts of sound, composition, and spatial interaction. Through immersive installations and performances, he invites audiences to explore and co-create his experiential works. His projects have been presented at SFMOMA, ZKM, Ars Electronica, the Stedelijk Museum, and Art Basel. Van der Heide is a lecturer at Leiden University and formerly coheaded the ArtScience Interfaculty in The Hague. Encor Studio seeks to reveal the invisible and reshape perception to connect people to their surroundings by employing experimental, self-developed tools and a reductionist, subtractive approach to composition and design. Founded in 2016 by four Swiss audiovisual artists, Mirko Eremita (b. 1986), David Houncheringer (b. 1983), Manuel Oberholzer (b. 1979), and Valerio Spoletini (b. 1981), Encor Studio was honored at the 23rd Japan Media Arts Festival and has exhibited at the Yamagata Biennale, Centre 104 in Paris, EPFL Lab in Lausanne, Lyon Lumière, and SXSW, with a solo show at Monopol, Berlin.

Fatma Abdulhadi (b. 1988) is a Saudi silkscreen artist and educator. Active in the Kingdom's art scene since 2011, she manages the Silkscreen Studio at the Misk Art Institute. As a teaching artist, Abdulhadi has led workshops in Riyadh and across Saudi Arabia. Her exhibition history includes her solo show *Out of Print* in Riyadh, as well as group exhibitions at Berlin Art Week, Milan's Ex-Alt Exhibition, and the Third Arab Symposium of Fine Arts in Morocco. Her global perspective has been enriched by the Misk Art Institute International Residency in Berlin.

Francesco Simeti (b. 1968) is a New York-based Italian artist whose practice transforms decorative arts into incisive social commentary. Known for immersive, site-specific installations, he uses wallpaper and tapestry to juxtapose beauty with themes of conflict and environmental crisis. Simeti's large-scale commissions are permanently installed in the subway systems of Los Angeles, Chicago, and Brooklyn, with additional works held at the Victoria and Albert Museum, the Philadelphia Museum of Art, and the Cooper Hewitt, Smithsonian Design Museum.



Founded in 2007 by Mattia Carretti (b. 1981) and Luca Camellini (b. 1981), **fuse*** is a multidisciplinary studio that brings together artists, architects, engineers, and designers. Inspired by social and natural phenomena in dialogue with scientific research, its works integrate diverse fields of knowledge through collaborations with scientists and research centers. The studio's artworks transform artistic experiences into catalysts for awareness, empathy, and shared understanding, showcased at innovative venues including the Triennale di Milano, the National Taichung Theater, MoCA Taipei, and the National Museum of China.

Guillaume Cousin (b. 1978) is a French artist and scenographer who describes himself as an "experimenter-constructor," creating immersive works that merge physics, poetics, and perception. With a background in stage and lighting design, his practice investigates invisible forces and quantum principles. His notable work *Le Silence des Particules* has been presented at the Festival d'Avignon, Nuit Blanche Paris, and Hungary's INOTA Festival. Cousin transforms elemental materials into meditative environments, offering contemplative experiences that challenge perception and question collective understandings of reality.

His practice spans sculpture, installation, and printmaking, exploring cultural heritage, contemporary social narratives, and collective memory. Notable installations include *Al Nourhah Pillars* and *Maze of Delusion*. Returning to Noor Riyadh, Alattawi has also exhibited at BIENALSUR, the International Biennial of Contemporary Art of South America in Buenos Aires, and has received grants from the Misk Art Institute and Diriyah Gate Development Authority.

Iregular has received the Award of Excellence at the Japan Media Arts Festival and IDA's Best Interaction Design Award, and has showcased its work in more than 75 international exhibitions, including the Glow Light Festival, Les Bains Numériques in Paris, and the Shenzhen Light Festival.

An alumnus of NYU's Interactive Telecommunications Program, he designs bespoke lighting systems for installations that examine the influence of technology on perception, culture, and narrative. 



What is Noor Riyadh?

This theme mirrors Riyadh's dynamic evolution: a city weaving its heritage with forward-looking ambition, embracing light as a narrative medium to explore technology, connection, and the human experience across time and space.

Naming Conventions

Festival Name

- Use the full title Noor Riyadh 2025 at first mention in any communication (press releases, social media, speeches, or official correspondence).
- In subsequent mentions, you may use Noor Riyadh alone.
- Do not abbreviate the name (e.g., NR).
- Avoid informal variations such as "the light festival" unless contextually paired with the full name.

Festival Organization

- On first mention, use: "Noor Riyadh 2025 is organized by Riyadh Art, under the Royal Commission for Riyadh City (RCRC)."
- After that, you may refer to the organizer simply as Riyadh Art.
- You may also include: "Riyadh Art is one of the four mega projects of Riyadh, launched under the Kingdom's Vision 2030."

Curators

- On first reference, always state full names and titles:
 - Mami Kataoka Curatorial Advisory Lead
 - Sara Almutlaq Curator
 - Li Zhenhua Curator



Naming Conventions

Theme

- Always use the full and correct theme name for 2025:
- "In the Blink of an Eye"
- This theme reflects Riyadh's rapid transformation and explores the intersection of science, society, and self through the medium of light.
- Do not paraphrase, shorten, or rephrase the theme.

Titles and Honorifics

- Nouf Almoneef
 Director of Noor Riyadh
- Khalid Al-Hazani
 Vice President of Riyadh Life Sector at The Royal Commission for Riyadh
 City (RCRC), and Executive Director of Riyadh Art

Artists

- When referencing artists from previous editions, clearly state the year:
 - o "Janet Echelman (Noor Riyadh 2022)"
 - o "Muhannad Shono (Noor Riyadh 2021, 2023)"
- For 2025 participants, wait for official announcements before sharing names.
- Do not reference speculative or unconfirmed artists in advance of official releases


