
Barcelona. 23rd July 2018. A new web platform, which aims to be a meeting point between architecture and design professionals, has been launched today. **Twelve people and over 30 international writers** are involved in the project, which will generate updated weekly content. The web is published in two languages; **English and Spanish**.

Each month it will focus on a different theme. The first month has the title 'Urban versus Rural.'

"Megacities, garden communities, repopulated villages, urban landscapes, animal kingdoms; for the first edition of the website, we explore the shifting divide between the urban and rural environments, and how architects, designers and artists are responding."
